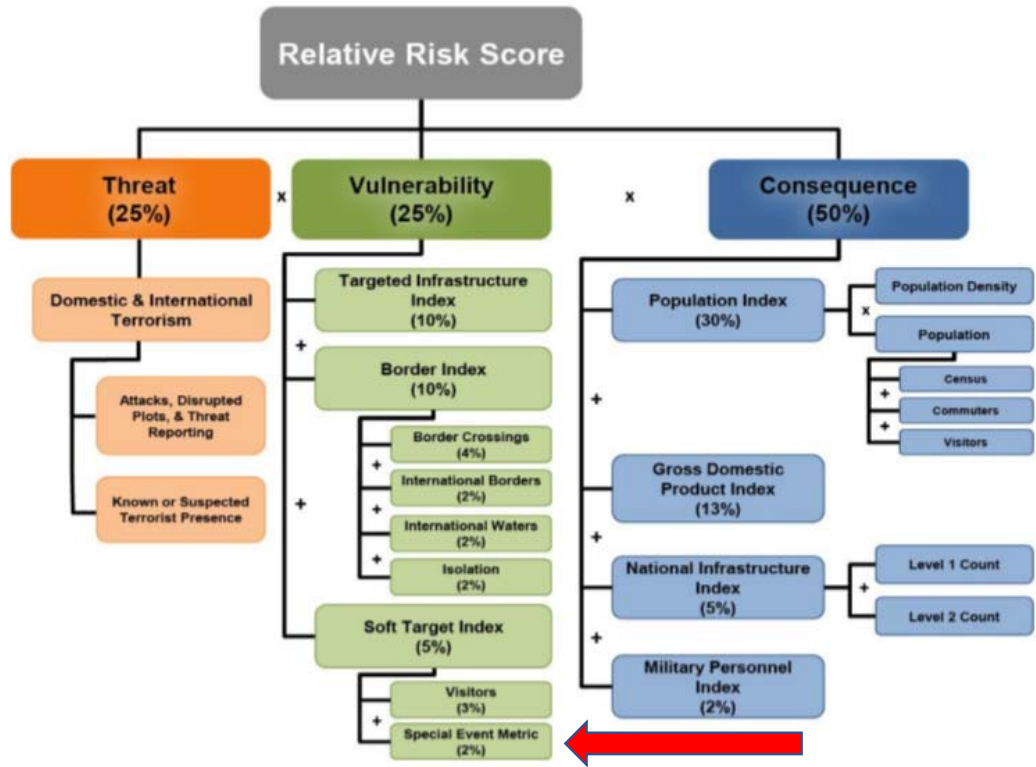

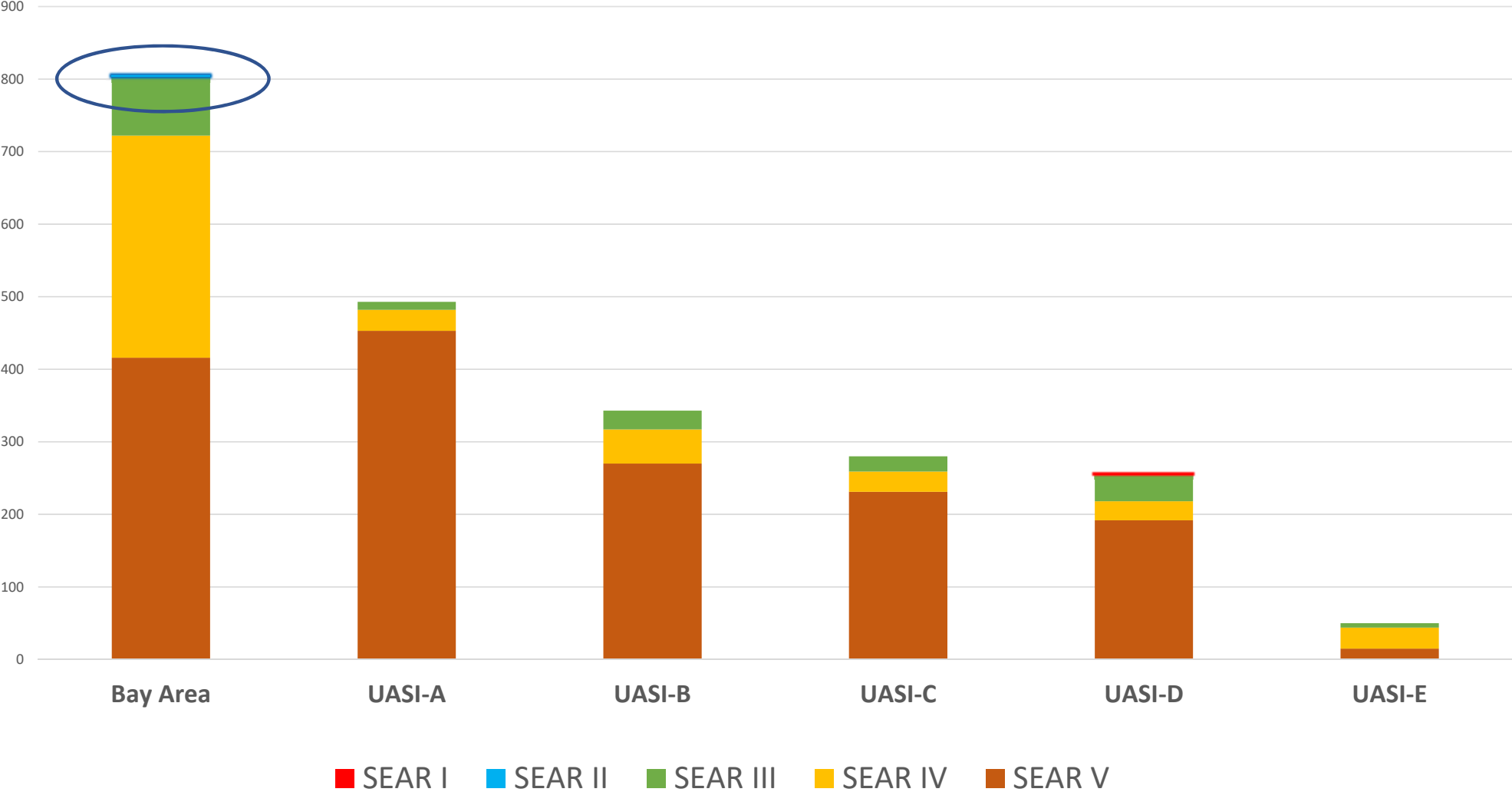

Bay Area UASI 2020 Relative Risk Score - 4th out of the 100 top MSAs





Stacked SEAR Events by UASI in 2019/2020

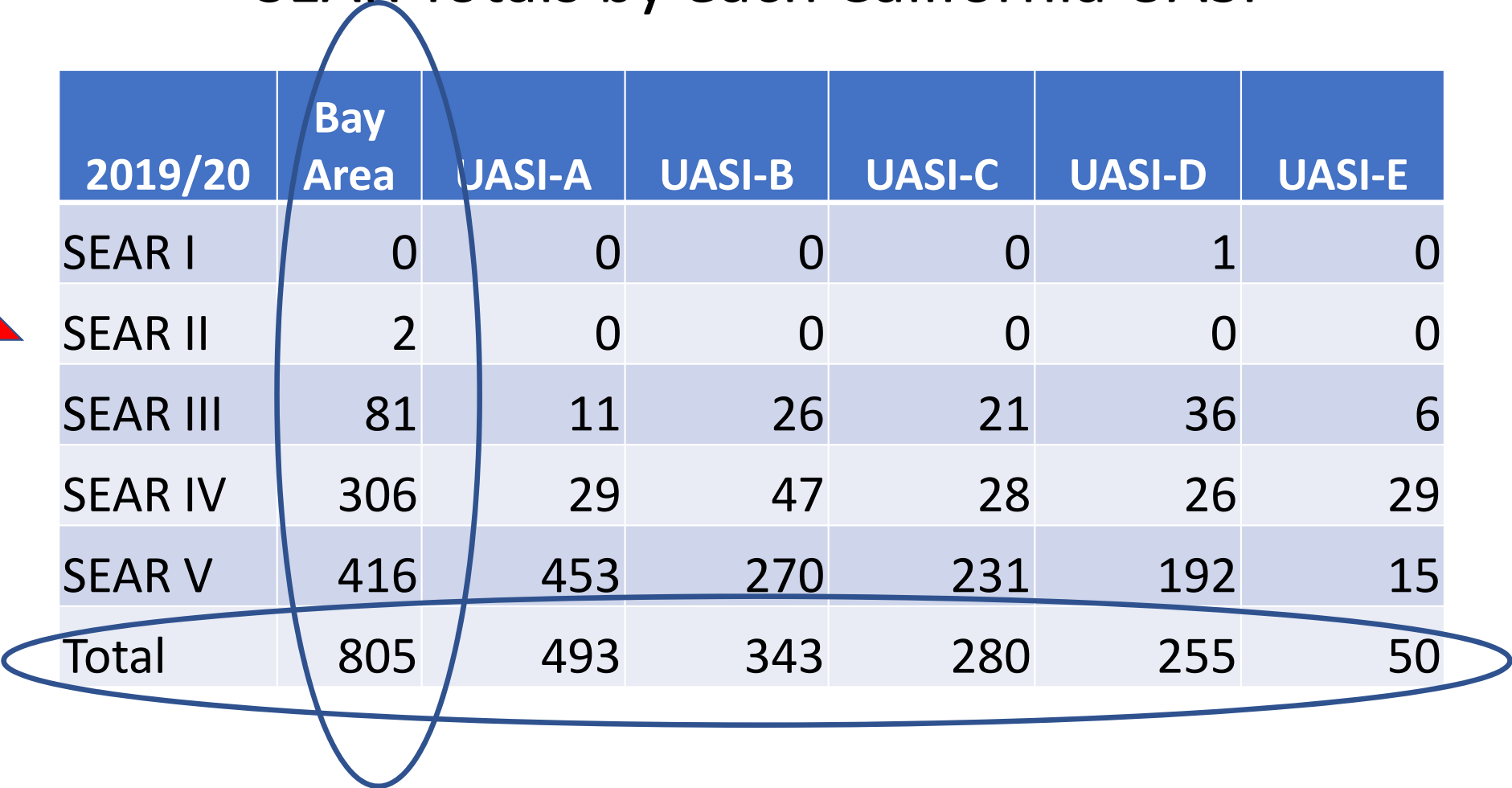
