**Background:**

The STC San Francisco Bay Area Program enhances the ability of the region to detect and prevent terrorist attacks and other high-consequence events involving radiological or other nuclear (RN) materials that pose risk to homeland security in high-risk urban areas (HRUAs) and their environs. The Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (BAUASI), comprises twelve counties and three major cities (San Jose, San Francisco, and Oakland), manages, and oversees the program through a Federal cooperative grant supervised by the Assistant Secretary for Countering Weapons of Mass Destructions (CWMD). In addition to the Bay Area UASI area of responsibility, the STC San Francisco Bay Area Program also includes the California counties of Sacramento and Washoe County in Nevada, as well as the pathways into these counties.

In support of this mission, the program will provide detection equipment, training, exercise support, operational and technical subject matter expertise, and programmatic support. The concept of operations is to develop regionally coordinated RN detection capabilities in and around high-risk urban areas to cover pathways leading to these areas and expanding this capability over time with priority given to higher risk areas.
