Bay Area UASI Training and Exercise Work Group Charter

Purpose

The Training and Exercise Work Group's (TEWG) purpose is to provide a forum for members to:

- participate in a fair, open, and transparent process to inform the Bay Area Training and Exercise Program (BATEP) of training and exercise priorities for their disciplines within the region
- review and comment on funding allocations, program successes, and opportunities for improvement

The TEWG supports nine of the ten Bay Area UASI Goals identified for FY21, and each of their associated Core Capabilities.¹

2	Enhance the Protection of Soft Targets*
3	Enhance Cybersecurity*
4	Address Emergent Threats*
5	Enhance Medical and Public Health Preparedness

9	Enhance All-Hazards Incident Planning, Response & Recovery Capabilities

* Designated a National Priority and requiring a 5% or more allocation of UASI funds.

Work Group Objectives

- Using the THIRA, SPR, and other capability building projects, inform the development of and maintain a 3-year preparedness outlook and strategy resulting in an Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP) which outlines the training and exercise program needs for the Bay Area UASI region and provides a schedule of funded training courses and exercise opportunities, in alignment with the above goals.
- Provide a mechanism for sharing and coordinating training and exercise opportunities across disciplines, jurisdictions, and partners.
- Serve as subject matter experts on the training and exercise needs for specific disciplines.
- Coordinate with BATEP on the delivery of training courses (serve as a host, ensure relevant stakeholders are aware of training courses, etc.)
- Coordinate with BATEP on exercise design, planning, conduct, and after-action reporting.
- Regularly review training and exercise priorities and discuss the program's allocation of funds.

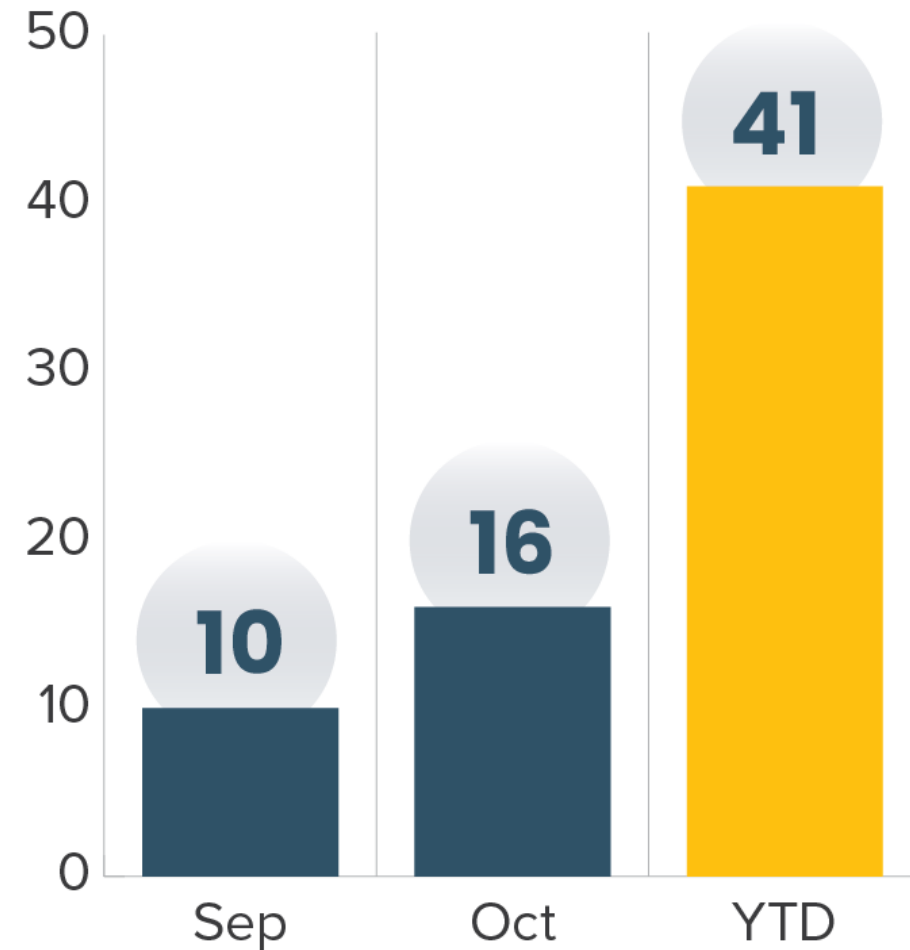

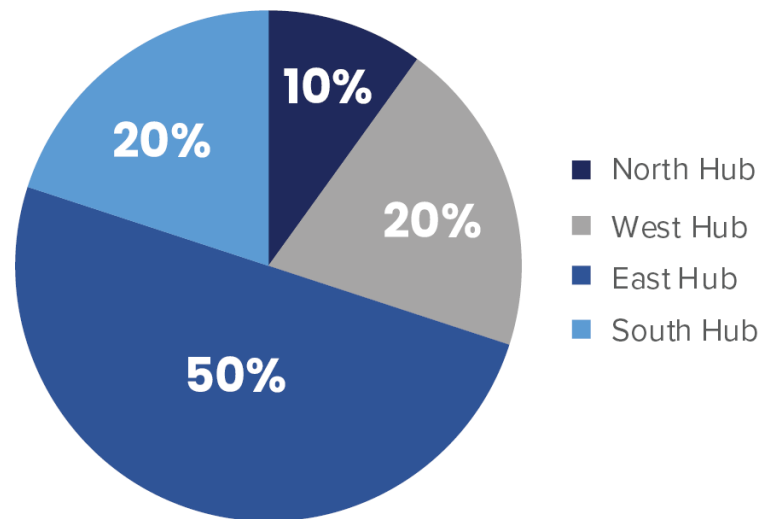
