Public Participation:

It is the policy of the Approval Authority to encourage and permit public participation and comment on matters within the Approval Authority's jurisdiction, as follows:

- *Public Comment on Agenda Items.* The Approval Authority will take public comment on each item on the agenda. The Approval Authority will take public comment on an action item before the Approval Authority takes any action on that item. Persons addressing the Approval Authority on an agenda item shall confine their remarks to that particular agenda item. For each agenda item, each member of the public may address the Approval Authority once, for up to three minutes. The Chair may limit the public comment on an agenda item to less than three minutes per speaker, based on the nature of the agenda item, the number of anticipated speakers for that item, and the number and anticipated duration of other agenda items.
- *General Public Comment.* The Approval Authority shall include public comment as an agenda item at each meeting of the Approval Authority. During public comment, each member of the public may address the Approval Authority on matters within the Approval Authority's jurisdiction. Issues discussed during public comment must not appear elsewhere on the agenda for that meeting. Each member of the public may address the Approval Authority once during public comment, for up to three minutes. The Chair may limit the total public comment to 30 minutes and may limit the time allocated to each speaker depending on the number of speakers during public comment and the number and anticipated duration of agenda items.
- *Speaker Identification.* Individuals making public comment may be requested, but not required, to identify themselves and whom they represent.
- *Designated Public Comment Area.* Members of the public wishing to address the Approval Authority must speak from the public comment area.
- *Comment, Not Debate.* During public comment, speakers shall address their remarks to the Approval Authority as a whole and not to individual Approval Authority representatives, the General Manager or Management Team members, or the audience. Approval Authority Representatives and other persons are not required to respond to questions from a speaker. Approval Authority Representatives shall not enter into debate or discussion with speakers during public comment, although Approval Authority Representatives may question speakers to obtain clarification. Approval Authority Representatives may ask the General Manager to investigate an issue raised during public comment and later report to the Approval Authority. The lack of a response by the Approval Authority to public comment does not necessarily constitute agreement with or support of comments made during public comment.
- *Speaker Conduct.* The Approval Authority will not tolerate disruptive conduct by individuals making public comment. Speakers who use profanity or engage in yelling, screaming, or other disruptive behavior will be directed to cease that conduct and may be asked to leave the meeting room.

(a) FY 2022 UASI Grant (Discussion Only)

On February 17, 2022, Congress passed a partial Continuing Resolution to provide funding for Federal government programs through March 11, 2022. In order to release the FY 2022 UASI Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), Congress will need to pass legislation for appropriations of the entire 2022 fiscal year.

(b) Management Team Update (Discussion Only)

Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Regional Program Manager Position

Christophe Arnold has been promoted to the regional program manager position overseeing the RCPGP grant initiatives. Mr. Arnold previously served as an emergency services coordinator for the UASI Bay Area Training and Exercise Program (BATEP) providing technical and administrative support. Mr. Arnold has more than 16 years of emergency management experience working abroad as a project manager for a number of international organizations. He holds a bachelor's degree in political science from Simon Fraser University, British Columbia, Canada as well as a master's degree in development studies IHEID (Graduate Institute in International Relations and Development Studies), Geneva, Switzerland.

Senior Manager Assistant Position

The Management Team is in the process of conducting interviews for the senior manager assistant position who will serve as the UASI office administrator, as well as our website administrator. The position will be filled later in March 2022.

Regional Grant Program Manager

The Management Team will be working with our HR Department to backfill the regional grant program manager position who oversees grant compliance and serves as the liaison between the Bay Area UASI and Cal OES/FEMA.

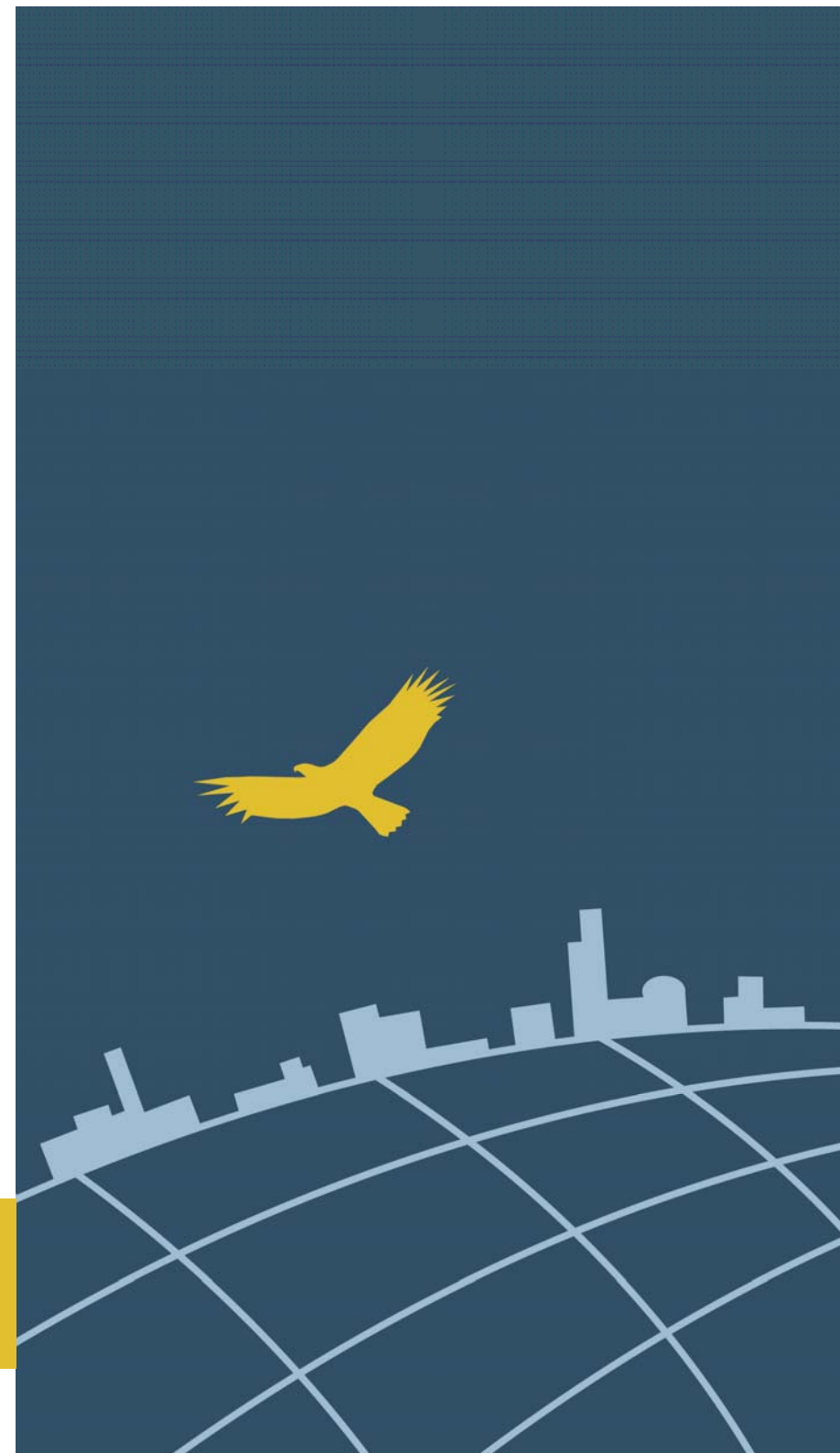

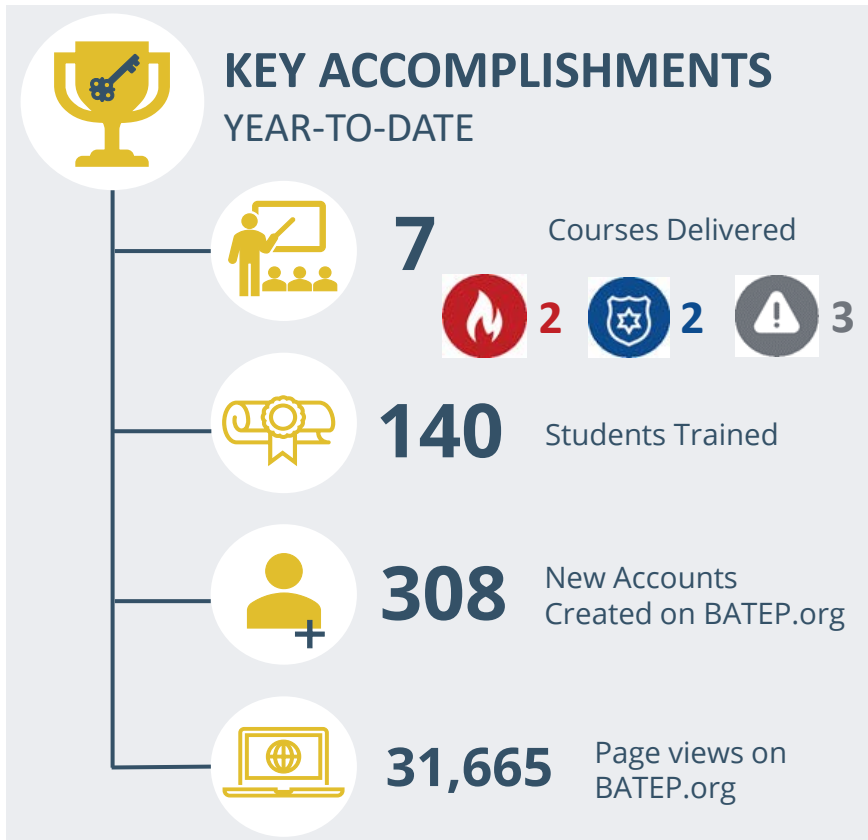

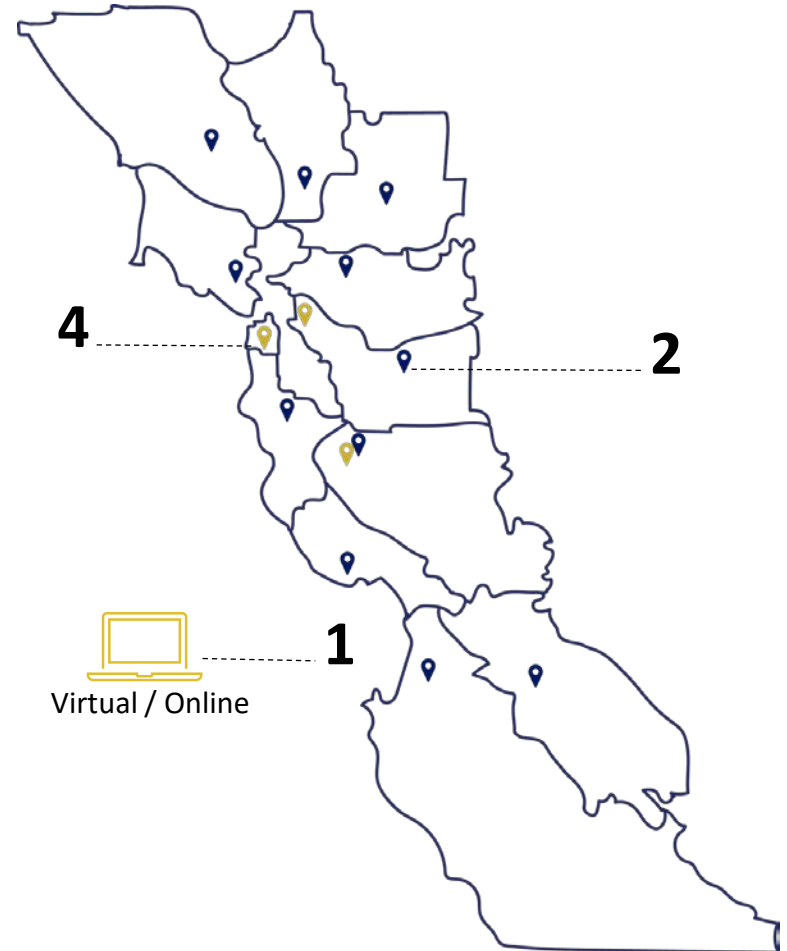


Year-to-Date

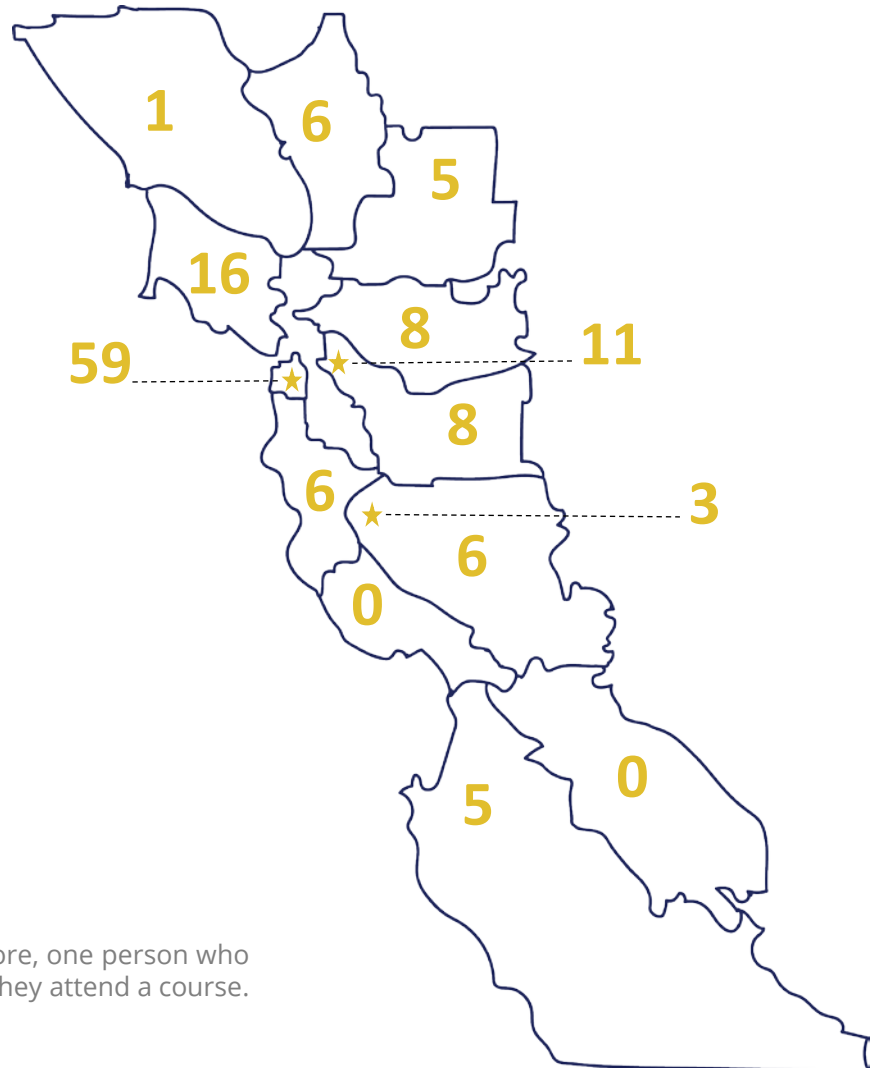

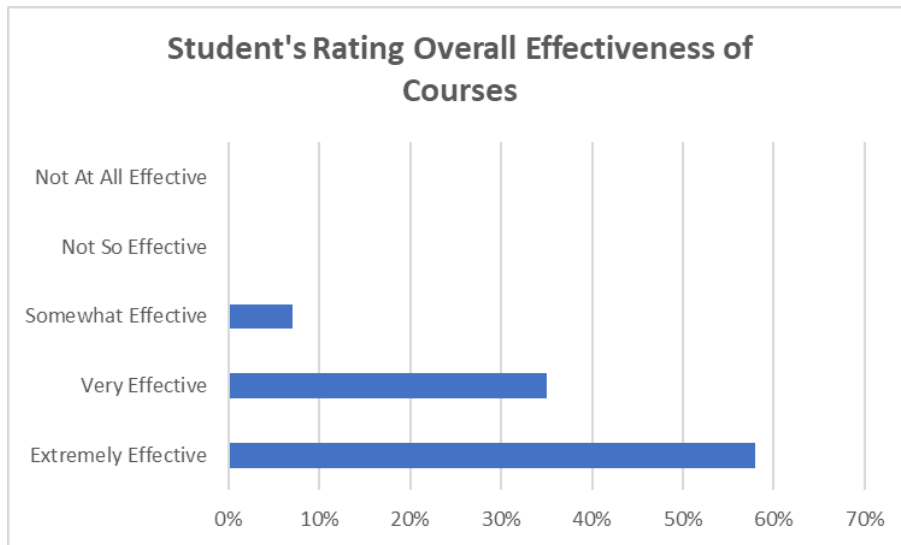
Students Trained by UASI Member Jurisdiction

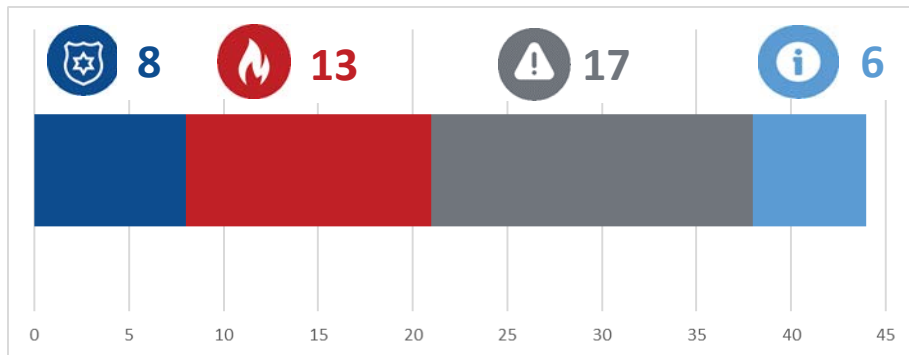

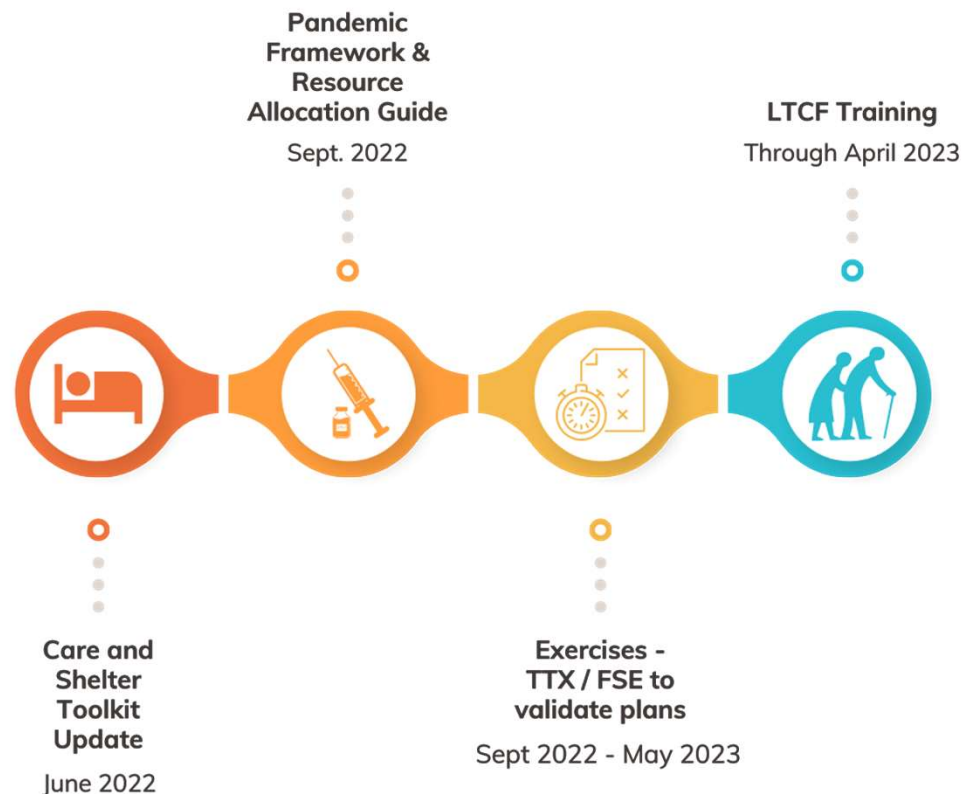

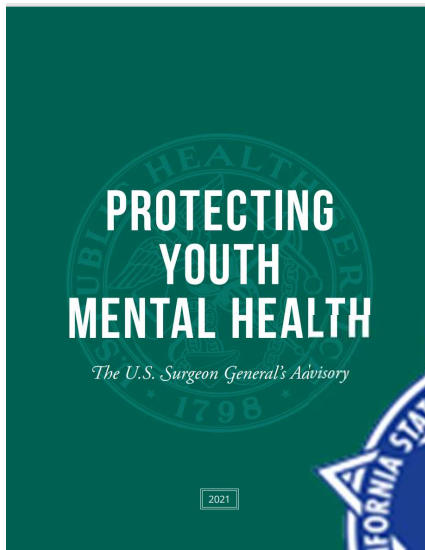

The Domestic Violent Extremism National Priority Area Explained

In fiscal year (FY) 2021, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is requiring that Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) recipients spend a minimum of 7.5% of total State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) and Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) allocations to address Domestic Violent Extremism (DVE).

Overview

Combating terrorism continues to be a priority for the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). As noted in the [Homeland Threat Assessment](#) (October 2020), foreign terrorist organizations (FTOs) still intend to attack the United States within and from beyond our borders. However, the primary terrorist threat inside the United States now comes from lone offenders and small cells of individuals, including Domestic Violent Extremists and foreign terror inspired Homegrown Violent Extremists (HVEs).

Some U.S.-based violent extremists have capitalized on increased social and political tensions in 2020 that are driving an elevated threat environment. Ideologically motivated violent extremists with objections to the exercise of governmental authority and the presidential transition, as well as other perceived grievances, could continue to mobilize to incite or commit violence. These violent extremists will continue to target individuals or institutions that represent symbols of their grievances, as well as grievances based on political affiliation or perceived policy positions.

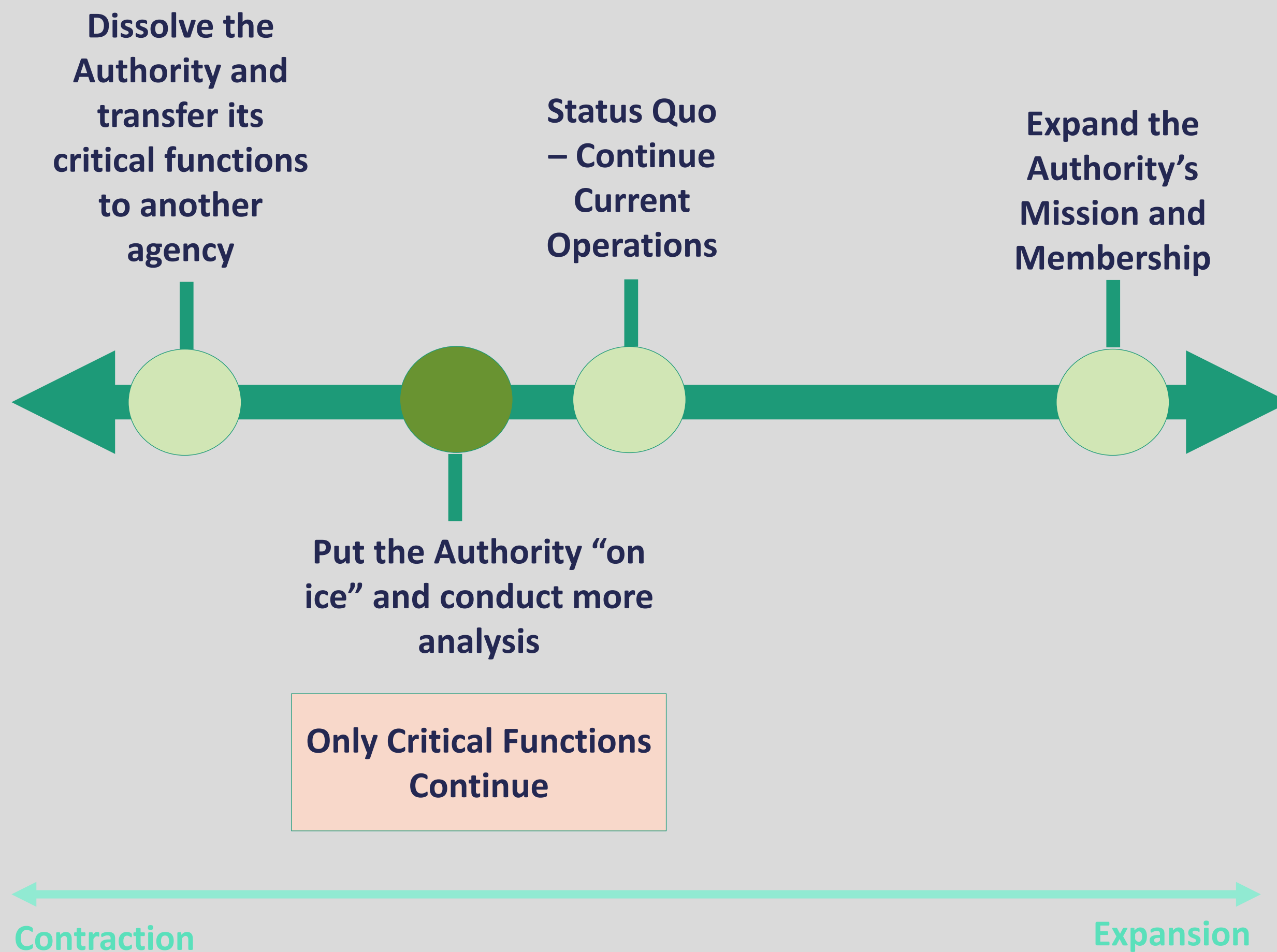

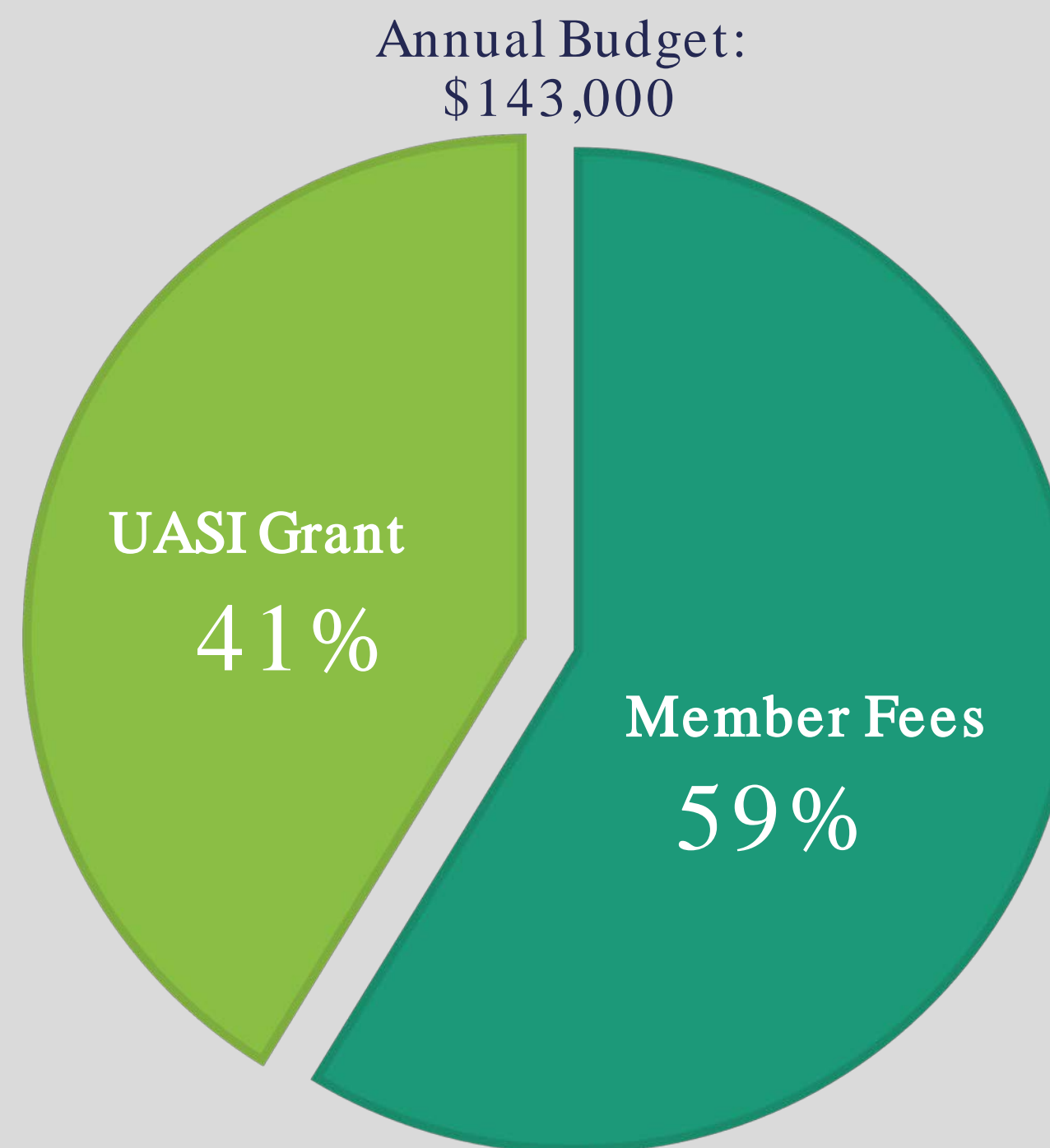

Background:

The Bay Area UASI website is outdated and hasn't been updated for more than 10 years. The UASI website is used by hundreds of Bay Area stakeholders to access regionally funded products, and information and sharing of the four grant funded regional programs. The website is also used for grants management regarding fiscal and compliance grant guidelines and tools.

The Bay Area UASI grant programs have expanded to the point where our current website can no longer meet the needs of our stakeholders. Over the past eighteen months alone, the Management Team has absorbed the Regional Training and Exercise Program, added three new grant programs, and produced numerous products and services.

The Management Team has scoped a Digital Services project to provide recommendations to enhance the Bay Area UASI website. Such recommendations would include plans to support distance learning through a Bay Area Training and Exercise Program Learning Management System, enhanced stakeholder engagement, an enhanced meeting management platform, and continuity of access across all grant programs.
